## Pistol Permit Applications

As of 10-01-09  
Public Act 01-130

Those persons having pistol permit applications filed before 10-01-01 and having not been rejected for the possession of a town permit will be issued a Temporary State Permit. Persons whose Town Permit is near expiration will be issued a Temporary State Permit. Persons with Expired Town Permits must begin the process as listed below; Temporary State Permits cannot be issued to persons whose Town Permit has expired.

Applications filed on or after 10-01-09 should be filed as follows:

1. A completed Temporary Permit Application
2. Completed state and federal fingerprint cards plus **2 SEPERATE** bank check's or money order's made payable to "D.P.S." One for \$50.00 and one for \$19.25.
3. A check made payable to the "Town of Old Saybrook" in the amount of \$35.00
4. A firearms safety and use course certificate.
5. Non- residents of Old Saybrook are not processed in Old Saybrook; they must contact their own town police or resident state trooper or barracks.

On successful receipt of a Temporary State Pistol Permit the applicant will have ONLY 60 DAYS to contact the Department of Public Safety for a regular permit. If you do not obtain a State Pistol Permit within such time you MUST BEGIN THE PROCESS ALL OVER AGAIN.

On applying for a State Pistol Permit the applicant must:

1. Surrender the Temporary State Permit
2. Present a bank check or money order for \$35.00 made payable to the "D.P.S." which will be refunded if the State Permit is not issued.
3. Bring a full face photograph of the permittee will be taken at the time of the application for the State Permit
4. Background checks will be done at the time of application.
5. The State Permit will be valid for 5 years unless revoked.

### Out of State Residents/ Non- Residents

Any bona fide resident of the United States having no bona fide residence or place of business within the jurisdiction of any local authority in the state, but has a permit or license to carry a pistol or revolver issued by the authority of another state or subdivision of the United States, may apply **DIRECTLY** to the Special Licensing and Firearms Unit for a Connecticut Pistol Permit.

Applicants residing in a state without pistol permits need to submit a letter from their local jurisdiction-stating competency to carry firearms.

Backgrounds and fees will be payable to the Commissioner of Public Safety and the D.P.S.
